The months of September and October were packed with tournaments for the ladies.

NEW MEMBERS

A big warm welcome to our two new lady members, Lucia Chipungu and Tendayi Mhiribidi.

MARGARET DAVY

The weather for the Margaret Davy Tournament - hosted by Royal Harare Ladies Golf Section on Sat 23rd and Sun 24th September - was second to none. Royal Ladies had lined up excellent sponsors and all that remained to all participants to enjoy their golf – and the Chapman One team certainly did that. The team comprised of Linda O'Toole, Ros Russell, Keara O'Toole, and Danielle Bekker.

A tournament played over two days and a maximum of 72 holes it was clear from early on that this Chapman team was a force to be reckoned with. Linda won ALL FOUR of her matches. Danielle beat Batsirai Tilowakuti

convincingly, got a walkover against Beki Pasi – and then went on to lose by a narrow margin against Yollander Mubaiwa of Royal. Keara lost by a narrow margin to Linda Kamalizeni and went on to win two of her other matches. Ros Russell also won two of her matches.

Brooke One vs Chapman One was an exciting final in its own right. Two matches were WON by Chapman – by Danielle Bekker and Linda O'Toole against Shamiso Makwarao and Angela Leicht respectively. Two matches were WON by Brooke – by Amanda Michelle and Ilonka Bekker (against Ros Russell and Keara O'Toole respectively). This outcome of 2 wins each forced a PLAYOFF between these two teams.

As indicated by the Tournament Organisers this would be a three-hole playoff – matchplay – each ball to be put in the hole – between the two first seeds. So Shamiso Makwara (BROOKE) took on Danielle Bekker (CHAPMAN). Danielle missed a putt she should have sunk on # 1 and went 1 under. On # 2 Shamiso tee'd off first and put her shot 1.5 meters from the pin. Danielle put her tee shot into the bunker. Things did not look good for Chapman at this stage. Danielle was talking to her caddy Whisper as she walked up to the bunker – she proceeded to do THREE practice swings OUTSIDE the bunker – and then got inside the bunker to address a very challenging lie. By this time a decent crowd of supporters had gathered to support this exciting playoff at Royal – and as Danielle got in the bunker there was a deathly hush. She hit the ball – it landed short and started rolling – and rolled straight into the hole for a BIRDIE bringing the play off to level. Now all of a sudden from a certain win Shamiso had to fight to try and do something on # 18 since there was only one hole left. The crowd support was deafening and needless to



say Danielle now walked forward to # 18 with a spring in her step. All stalwart Chapman supporters by this stage were in tears and the excitement was clearly too much for most of us....



A cracking drive on # 18 put Danielle some distance ahead of Shamiso – and then a great second shot put her just off the back of the green but not far from the pin. Danielle missed the birdie putt by an inch or two – leaving a certain par tap in – to win the three hole matchplay off and securing the win for the CHAPMAN team. A super crowd had followed the playoff – and they were rewarded with a very high standard of golf as well as all the emotion that comes with this level of anticipation. WELL DONE Chapman One Team – and congratulations Danielle for being one of the winners two years in a row.

HARARE PROVINCE STROKEPLAY

The Harare Province Ladies Strokeplay Championships had already had a "trial run" earlier this year on Sat 4th and Sun 5th

March 2017 but was unfortunately rained out and thus postponed. So the anticipation for this event was great – and although not everyone could make it back there was nonetheless solid support for this tournament.

The venue was Wingate Golf Club and this was the last Provincial Ladies Strokeplay to be played for the year. At least 44 ladies participated over the two days being Sat 9th and Sun 10th September.

At the end of day one Emily Jones lead the field with 78 and Danielle was lying 5 strokes behind on 83. At the turn (after 9 holes) on day two Emily turned on 39 and Danielle turned on 34 – thus by this stage Danielle had already made up the 5 strokes that she was behind on the first day. Danielle then continued to shoot a 34 back nine making her round a 68 and win the tournament by three strokes.

To card the 68 on day two Danielle shot 1 bogey, 12 pars, and 5 birdies.

Danielle was the defending champion of the Ladies HPLGA strokeplay having beaten Batsirai Tilowakuti last year in a three-hole play-off at the Brooke.

This HPLGA strokeplay is a sentimental one for Danielle: on 6th and 7th July 2013 at the Country Club at the age of 10 years old Danielle played her FIRST Ladies Strokeplay off a 36 handicap and thus in C Division. Danielle managed to win the C Division after playing in a three-hole play-off against Anne Ferrao.

'GREENS AND FAIRWAYS'





Birds for this month, both species are common and are regularly seen at number 5 green and number 6 tee box under the large acacia tree.

The upper picture is of the common grey Lourie (Old Name) new name "Grey Turaco" also known as the "Grey Go Away bird"....I stand to be corrected on this!!!!!

The latter is the Common African Hoopoe (*Upupa Africana*)

Where to Take relief from

No.57 Placing / Dropping a Ball



During a period of wet weather, a Committee introduces a temporary Local Rule whereby a player whose ball lies through the green may mark, lift, clean and place their ball within six inches of where it was at rest, not nearer the hole.

Question 1:

If a player's ball has come to rest in the rough may they place their ball on the fairway, providing it is within the six inches permitted by the Local Rule?

Question 2:

A player has placed their ball at rest on a tuft of grass. As they move away it falls off the raised grass and settles in a depression. May they replace their ball?

Answer 1:

Yes. There is no distinction in the Rules between fairways and rough, both are covered by the term 'through the green'.

Answer 2:

No. A player may place their ball only once; it is in play when it has been placed and is at rest. Rule 20-4. The player incurs a penalty stroke under Rule 18-2a if they touch it again.



In taking relief under the Rules a player drops their ball at the nearest point of relief in the rough and it rolls onto the fairway, not nearer the hole.

Ouestion 3:

Must the player play their ball from the fairway or do they have to re-drop their ball?

Question 4:

How far may a ball roll from where it first strikes a part of the course after being dropped under the Rules?

Question 5:

If a ball is dropped in the rough and it rolls into a hazard must it be re-dropped?

Answer 3:

The player must play their ball from the fairway. There is no distinction in the Rules between fairway and rough; both are covered by the term 'through the green'.

Answer 4:

The ball may roll up to two club-lengths, not nearer the hole. Rule 20-2c (iv).

Answer 5:

Yes, the ball must be re-dropped. Rule 20-2c(i)

"Yes," cried the golfer.


The Lord was furious. "You lied! That is an untruth!"
