The course and surrounds we will continue to clean up and make tidy where we have excessive over growth as pointed out to us by observant members. These pointers are both welcome and beneficial to our endeavors to get the course to the condition that we know it can be****

100m distance markers...We will be adding some form of markers at members request for these. These will be put just off the fairways to assist members with distances. Remember that Chapman distances are measured to the front of the Green and not the middle as with some other Clubs.

The greens as we speak, speak for themselves. There is a notable improvement (if we must say so our selves) however we will continue to nurture them to get consistent speeds and professional cutting for a better surface/mat to putt on.

We must compliment the "Members" for the improvement on the pitch mark repairs we do however still face challenges (the fast last words) from other players who continually ignore our calls for pitch repairs/scuffing and divot repairs.

The divots and un-raked bunkers is still a cause for concern but we will endeavor to attempt to educate all.

Golf Rulings/dos and don'ts

Before walking onto the Par-3 4th tee Linda asks Elsa, her fellow competitor, what club she is going to use. Elsa replies that she is going to use a 6-iron. Thinking that Elsa can hit the ball further than she can Linda decides to use her 5-iron. She overshoots the green and her ball settles under a bush. There is no way she can get a club to her ball right-handed, so she stabs at it with a left-handed stance, using the back of the club-head to move her ball forward. Having cleared the bush she then pitches onto the putting green and takes two putts to finish the hole. What is Linda's score for the hole?

Answer.

- 1 & 2 Two penalty strokes for asking her fellow competitor for advice on what club she was going to use on the hole (Rule 8-1b).
- 3 Tee shot.
- 4 Left-handed stroke from under bush.

Note: A ball may be struck with any part of the club-head (Rule 14-1).

- 5 Pitch onto green.
- 6 & 7 Putts to hole out.

Note: Elsa is also penalized two strokes for giving advice on the club that she intended to use.

She should have refused to answer the question (Rule 8-1a).

Linda's scores 7 for the hole.

Learn the Rules and avoid penalties....

Player's Edition of the

Rules of Golf

Effective January 2019

Introduction

The "Player's Edition of the Rules of the Golf" is the publication to be circulated to golfers worldwide. It is not a quick guide, but rather is an abridged version of the Rules of Golf that is written with a focus on you, the golfer.

Here are some of the key elements of the Player's Edition:

It is a functioning Rule book. It looks like the full Rules of Golf, with generally the same organization. Although its text is edited, it gives you the same answer that is in the full Rules of Golf.

It focuses on the Rules that are most relevant to you as a player. This includes the Rules that describe the essential characteristics of golf - for example, playing by the Rules and in the spirit of the game, the different parts of the course and the equipment you may use - and the most commonly used Rules.

Although it does not cover some of the less frequently occurring situations, it indicates that there is further information on the subject in the full Rules of Golf, with the following reference icon:

This icon means that you should refer to the full Rules of Golf (either in printed format or via The R&A's Rules of Golf app or website – RandA.org), or consult with the Committee for an explanation of that situation.

It is written in a style that refers to "you" the golfer. This golfer-focused style is another key step in making the Rules more user-friendly.

Diagrams and charts are included to help visually explain the Rules.

The Player's Edition aims to present the Rules in a way that is more easily understood and focused on what you, the golfer, need to know to play by the Rules.....

TAFADZWA NYAMUKONDIWA – JUNIOR ORANGE BOWL GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP

Tafadzwa Nyamukondiwa has been selected to represent Zimbabwe at the Junior Orange Bowl International Golf Championship which will be held at the Biltmore Golf Course in Miami – Florida USA from 2-6 January 2019. This is an annual tournament where the best junior players are invited. The criteria for participation is as follows; Must not have reached their 19th birthday by January 6, 2019 and not participating on a College/University team. The tournament provides a great opportunity for players to meet and liaise with American university coaches in their bid to secure scholarships.

Past notable winners of the tournament include Tiger Woods (1991), the late Lewis Chitengwajnr (1992), Kevin Na (2000), Joaquin Niemann (2014). Each year Zimbabwe has managed to send at least one representative who has gone on to secure a university scholarship.

To acclimatise to his new environment, we would like to send him at least two weeks before the tournament so that he can participate in at least two tournaments before the main one. Therefore, we are looking at raising a total of US7,000 which will cover his Air ticket, Accommodation and meals.

Tafadzwa Nyamukondiwa started playing golf in August 2011 at Wingate Park Golf Club and later moved to join Chapman Golf Club where he has remained a member. At the age of 15 he captained Zimbabwe in the Tri-Nations tournament (Malawi, Zambia, Zimbabwe) which Zimbabwe hosted and subsequently triumphed. He went on to represent Zimbabwe in the All Africa Golf Championship which Zimbabwe hosted in 2017 at Royal Harare Golf Club and Zimbabwe qualified for Japan after finishing in second place. He then represented Zimbabwe in Japan in the Toyota World Golf Junior 2017. He is currently ranked the number one junior golfer in the country and 2nd on the amateur National Order of merit. Here are some of his scores for the tournaments he has played 2017 Elephant Hills Open (78,74,73,73), 2017 All Africa Junior Championship (78,75,75,71), 2018 National Aids Council Pro-Am (75,74,74),won the amateur tournament 2018 Rowland Park Open (72,67,71),came second in the Chapman Grandslam (76,69,68), Matabeleland Junior tournaments -Loxton Trophy 70,69.
